

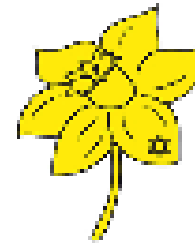
THE DAFFODIL PROJECT aspires to build a worldwide Living Holocaust Memorial by planting 1.5 million daffodils in memory of the 1.5 million children who were murdered during the Holocaust and in support of children suffering in humanitarian crises around the world. To date, 180,000 daffodils have been planted, including 1800 in Clarkston. The yellow daffodil bloom is reminiscent of the Yellow Star that Jews throughout Europe were forced to wear during the Holocaust. The daffodils are symbolic because they are resilient and return with a burst of color and energy each spring, reminding us that life is eternal.
